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National Security Act regulations, enemy aliens were not allowed to travel outside the police district in which they lived, even to go to the city to do some shopping, without permission of the local registration officer. That permission would not be withheld, unless there were some particular reason why it should. Permits for a month to go to specified places could be obtained.

WOMAN PRESENTS PROBLEM

Difficulty as to how to deal with Ethel May Bryant, 33, of Franklin street, city, was experienced by the magistrate. She was convicted of having had insufficient lawful means of support.

Constable Schroeder gave evidence that about 3.30 p.m. on Wednesday he and Constable Hansberry found defendant in the West Parklands with another woman and three men and a youth of 20, all convicted persons. There were several empty wine bottles on the ground and an empty bottle of methylated spirits in a fork of a tree. All seemed to be suffering from the effects of recent heavy drinking. Defendant told him that she had slept under an arch of the railway bridge the previous night. Three of the men had also been there. She added that they had been there for a week. One of the men had had £12, and they had had 128 bottles of wine, costing 10d each. He had repeatedly warned her to cease loitering in Light square and Waymouth street, city. He had often seen her with soldiers who were under the influence of liquor. She usually associated with well-known wine and methylated spirits drinkers, and with reputed thieves. She had been under his observation for about nine months, during which he had never known her to do any work.

Police Prosecutor Crafter said that defendant had 16 previous convictions, all except one in 1939, during last year. The police believed that she was a half-caste aborigine.

Asked by the magistrate if anything had been done for her, Inspector Crafter said that the women police had done all they could, but it was useless.

Mr. Morgan—There does not seem to be any advantage in sending her back and back to goal.

Defendant was remanded until Saturday for certain enquiries to be made. She was allowed bail in her own bond of £15.
