

The development of a spur line, railway station and bus interchange here will not only make access to places and services across Port Adelaide easier but will also improve tourism opportunities and increase the usage of public transport.

We also have a number of projects that will accelerate action to adapt for climate change, reduce gas emissions, promote energy and water efficiency, support the greening of PAE, create jobs for the growth of green businesses, grow the local circular economy, and support the conservation of our coast and waterways. We also continue to focus on our economic recovery and continue to work with and support our local businesses to reinvigorate themselves and look forward to a bright future. Ward in focus Parks

The Parks Ward is situated in the heart of PAE and includes the suburbs of Angle Park, Croydon Park, Devon Park, Dry Creek, Dudley Park, Ferryden Park, Gepps Cross, Mansfield Park, Ottoway, Regency Park, Wingfield and Woodville Gardens. It is bordered by Salisbury Highway, Grand Junction Road, Hanson Road plus nonarterial roads and the railway line.





Reg Robinson Reserve in Mansfield Park was named after Reginald Wilson Robinson, who was a Councillor for Enfield from 1967 to 1971 and 1973 to 1994. The reserve is now an urban biodiversity site and is the location of We have received State and Federal funding to our first community planting day for 2021 on

The variety and accessibility of our open spaces make life in the Parks so enjoyable, and I have been advocating for their care for the fifty years that I have lived here.

We have many wonderful open spaces that are popular with locals and visitors alike. Each reserve portrays the history of the area and the diversity of our community, and these are a few of my favourites. Richard Day Reserve on York Terrace reflects our colonial past. Tao Dan on Sutherland Road has elements that recognise the strong Vietnamese community. The Veteran Memorial Reserve on Norton Street commemorates those who have served for our country. The Community Garden at Ridley Grove Uniting Church is a community based project focussed on organic gardening.

In recent times some good outcomes have been achieved for Parks Ward. Hanson Reserve has a history of cycling and to continue with this legacy a velodrome was reconstructed in 2019. It has a fitness loop path, play space and picnic facilities for families to use. The velodrome is currently home to a few local cycling sporting clubs. The Regency Park nearby also experienced some developments. An upgrade of the playground was done in 2020 with new rubber soft fall, landscaping and refreshed equipment. Another exciting new project is currently under construction at the Regency Park Golf Course the building of a mini golf course for families to enjoy which will open soon. Many exciting things are happening in Parks Ward!

Over the last year the meaning of community has changed and evolved at every level. Two of the groups supported by PAE grants in the Parks Ward are Seeds for Change and Random Acts of Coffee. I've been so happy and honoured to see how both groups build grass roots community connections to make a wider change for us all. Although they have taken different routes - one fighting increasing urban temperatures and falling biodiversity by revegetating Ottoway, the other bringing caffeine and friendship across the city - they are amazing examples of people making their community better.



IT'S VERY EASY BEING GREEN

Electric garbage truck trial

A trial of an electric waste collection truck has begun as part of a joint-council waste contract between Cleanaway and the Cities of Adelaide, Charles Sturt, Marion and PAE. The trial will investigate the feasability of maintaining a consistent and reliable service of the electric vehicle under actual operating conditions. The truck is ideally suited for general cleaning and maintenance tasks. It will quietly go about its job while avoiding up to 20 tonnes of carbon dioxide annually that would otherwise be released by a diesel equivalent. This means it will significantly reduce noise, making early morning or late-night collections possible, which could help ease street congestion. The truck is expected to run for 120 kilometres on active duty before needing to recharge for at Cleanaway's depot in Port Adelaide. As well as charging from a power point, the truck captures energy from braking and stores it in a battery to power the electric motor. The City of PAE is excited to partner in this trial for the collection of our communities kerbside bins. It's another great collaboration between councils and industry for positive sustainability outcomes and reducing our carbon footprint.

GREEN ADELAIDE

ADAPTING TO CLIMATE CHANGE

AdaptWest is the Western Adelaide climate change adaptation plan, which is a collaborative project to prepare our community for the impacts of climate change and rising sea levels. In late 2021, a series of workshops will be held, funded by the Disaster Risk Reduction Grants Program by the South Australian State Government and the Commonwealth Department of Home Affairs.

Called AdaptNow, the program will expand on our previous work creating a Community Emergency Management Plan. Participants will explore a hypothetical situation with our community that involves the cascading impact of a three-week heatwave, bushfire smoke impact in our suburbs, power outages and a rain event that causes wide spread localised flooding. LEADING THE CHARGE

We're making it easy for you to charge your electric vehicles around PAE, as part of our long-term commitment to the future of our environment and green energy.

You can find charging stations on Nile Street Port Adelaide and the Esplanade Largs Bay, funded by the City of PAE as part of the Chargefox Network.

We also have chargers funded by Jolt, located near Kilburn Community Centre, with five more being installed soon, then around 30 over the next 15 years.

THE BIG TIPPER

PAE staff have been driving hybrid vehicles for a few years and we are working to expand our fleet, with SEA Electric currently building a battery powered tipper truck, the first of its kind in SA. The truck will be charged overnight and have enough power to silently run for the entire day, picking up and delivering materials to and from construction sites around the City and helping to maintain and upgrade our civil infrastructure. You'll see the truck on the road in the coming weeks.

Our Recovery

Better than before in PAE

n July 2020, our Elected Members endorsed our COVID-19 Recovery Framework, which mapped out the innovative way we planned to support our community to take the lead in recovery from the impacts of the global pandemic. Twelve months on, we are reflecting on the achievements of this past year, and the ways in which our community, Elected Members and staff have worked together towards recovery. The 45 projects that form our framework touch on all areas of community life including support services for individuals and our most vulnerable residents, business support programs, placemaking initiatives and environment projects. Throughout this work we have been inspired to see how many sections of our community acted quickly to adapt to the changes that we saw unfold during 2020.



LOVE OUR LIBRARIES

Leading the way

A focus of our recovery strategy has been to ensure that people have access to the technology and information they need and are encouraged to develop the skills to help them thrive. Staff at our five libraries moved quickly and skillfully to expand online services and programs, and provide the innovative Click and Collect loan services during lockdown. And we are continuing to respond to the increase in demand for technology through the provision of internet, computer, device and printing services. To support jobseekers, library staff can assist customers with the editing of resumes and job applications. Libraries are important local sites for learning and connection and have played a critical part in supporting the community with services and information to help them through the last year.

A TOP UP FOR TOURISM

PAE Pass makes holidays easy!

To boost our local tourism economy, we made it easy for residents to be a tourist in their own town with a PAE Pass. During the school holidays of October 2020 and April 2021, we subsidised tickets and memberships to some of our favourite attractions. Operators involved in the program include the Maritime, Railway and Aviation Museums, the City of Adelaide Clipper Ship, the Dolphin Explorer and Sanctuary Tours, the One and All and the Semaphore Carousel. With their PAE Pass, our local community could explore the wonderful attractions of our City, and increase visitation at our unique sites. Investing in tourism in the short term enabled us to support local business and kick start an industry which took a hit during the pandemic.

SHARING OUR STORIES

The Art of Reconciliation

We worked with the City of Charles Sturt to deliver a project featuring local Aboriginal people sharing their stories and reflecting on Reconciliation. Each participant was matched with a non-Aboriginal artist who created a portrait of their subject in their chosen style. As subject and artist got to know each other during interviews and the portrait sittings, we captured these conversations. A team of Indigenous crew members from Channel 44 recorded these exchanges and the creative process to develop a documentary to share with a wider audience. The resulting portraits, photographs by John Nieddu and digital stories were displayed at The Port Community Arts Centre during Reconciliation Week in May.

LINGER LONGER ON THE COAST

New outdoor spaces

There was an increased demand for outdoor dining options during the pandemic, with food businesses operating under new social distancing requirements. But beyond this, outdoor dining allows restaurants, cafes and other food businesses to use part of the footpath outside of their business to expand their trading area. Outdoor dining helps to activate streets, brings business opportunities and creates places where people can linger longer. As part of our recovery strategy, we are activating local precincts in Port Adelaide, Semaphore and Exeter. To enhance these popular public destinations we are installing safety bollards, street furniture and landscaping.



CHANGING ROOMS

Inclusive sporting facilities

After an extensive audit of our 50 sporting clubrooms and facilities, we have developed a 10-year plan for upgrades to these sites. Extensive work has already been carried out at Eastern Parade Reserve, with the changerooms there officially opened on Thursday 3 June. Making changing rooms across PAE more inclusive and accessible is an ongoing priority for us, making it easier for our diverse community to get involved in sport at a local level. It really was a team effort to complete these upgrades, with both the State government and Woodville West Torrens Football Club contributing to the cost of the two new sets of changerooms and toilets.

Other projects involve new change rooms, toilets and a kiosk at LJ Lewis Reserve and changeroom upgrades at the adjacent Edward Smith Reserve.

SAYING GOODBYE TO SMOKE

Kids helping us create cleaner playgrounds Following a presentation to Council by nineyear-old Amber from Hillcrest, we have been reminding everyone that all of our playgrounds are smoke-free.

In December 2020 we invited children to design a poster to let people know that smoking is banned in our playgrounds. We received some outstanding entries, which have been made into posters and signage that is now displayed at PAE facilities and buildings. Seven-year-old Jesaya's message was one of the winners:

Cigarette smoke makes it hard for me to breathe, when I smell it I choke up and I have to leave. I want fresh air in parks and playgrounds, so that it is healthy for everyone around! :)

VOLUNTEER BRINGS HISTORY TO LIFE

Helping to recognise our historic buildings

Greg has lived in the Port area his whole life, and has been a City of PAE volunteer since 2013. His first volunteer role was at the Semaphore Information Centre, located in the Semaphore Library and in 2018 he took on a secondary role in the local history room at the Port Library. His work involves researching local and state heritage listed properties in the area, with this information included on blue heritage plaques and the City of PAE heritage plaques webpage. Greg searches old news items, reports and government files to find details related to when the buildings were constructed, how they were used and by whom. For history month this year we conducted a guided tour of the buildings with heritage plaques in the Port Adelaide State Heritage Area. This included the Jackalope Gallery which was formerly the old coach house of the Port Admiral Hotel where hoteliers were required by law to provide stabling for horses of guests and travellers. Other significant buildings on the tour included the Muecke building in McLaren Parade and McKells in Timpson Street, both important businesses in Port Adelaide's rich history. Greg also spends one day a week digitising District of Port Adelaide birth certificates which belong to State Records. These records provide a fascinating insight into life in the Port area, and once indexed the information will be accessible online and searchable by anyone wishing to find out more about local or family history.

REIGN ON OUR PARADE

McLaren Parade revitalisation

Work has begun on McLaren Parade to transform this street into an inviting premium boulevard that connects the area.We are creating a high-quality public space in and around the riverfront, to encourage visitors and residents alike to use and enjoy the streets and wharves of Port Adelaide. We're building an inviting vibrant, green, pedestrian focussed environment. McLaren Parade is being converted into a one-way street with the removal of kerbing to create a low-speed street that prioritises pedestrians and cyclists. We are increasing streetscape greening and canopy coverage with shading and more wind protection, while adding public spaces and street furniture to encourage people to gather. To finish off the project there will be new public art created that is representative of the area. This work is being undertaken in two stages to allow construction of the new Rydges Hotels & Resorts Rydges on the Wharf. The total estimated cost for this streetscape project is \$1.85 million, with \$600,000 from the State Government Open Spaces and Places Grant Program, and the rest funded by the City of PAE.



Another Colour Our City mural completed When we asked you to suggest some spots around the city in need of extra colour, a dull, grey Pump House in Northgate Reserve was chosen. Northgate Reserve is located on the corner of Folland Ave and Dumfries Ave in Northgate. It is a large reserve featuring lakes, walking trails, a playground and a Pump House in need of a splash of colour. What was once the plain roof of the structure is now the main focal point of the Pump House, clearly seen from the road and the reserve. The Pump House is home to one of our water aquifer and recovery systems, which works to capture and filter stormwater before being reused to irrigate the reserve in an environmentally sustainable way. Funded under our COVID-19 Recovery Framework, artist Matthew Fortrose has reinvigorated this space by adding splashes of abstract geometric colour.




TOP BRASS

History of Enfield Brass Band

It is 60 years since Morgan Goode approached Jack Mitchell to discuss the possibility of establishing a boys' brass band in the Klemzig area.

That discussion, and subsequent meetings with the leader of a local gym club and a school principal, and canvassing of people living in Klemzig at the time led to a meeting at Mr Goode's home on 8 June 1960. Eleven people attended the meeting and formed a Committee to get the ball rolling. Three months later the first Learners Group began their study of the basics of the theory of music and were soon afterwards learning to play instruments. In 1967 the Klemzig Junior Band evolved into The Enfield Brass Band as the older learners turned 18 years of age. Today, in their distinctive maroon uniform jackets, they are still making music in Klemzig and surrounding districts. They play a wide repertoire of music and participate in competitions and community events (such as Anzac Day commemorations, concerts, fetes, and pageants). The band now meet at the Klemzig Community Hall, 242 North East Road, Klemzig (adjacent to Gaza Oval) each Wednesday evening at 7.30pm to rehearse. New adult and youth members are welcome.
