There are many reasons for parents, caregivers, and teachers to support and encourage children to read graphic novels.

A gateway to reading for kids

For children who do not normally enjoy reading or find it difficult, graphic novels give them another way into books. The images in graphic novels help readers understand the words that appear with them. This supports children to comprehend the story and decode and understand the words. When children can understand what they are reading, they develop a positive connection to reading which helps them stay active

A visual aid for English Language Learners

Combining images and words is helpful for children learning English as an additional language. It gives them a chance to learn the meaning of words they wouldn't understand in a plain-text novel.

Supporting autistic children with visual cues

Graphic novels can be a great resource for autistic children, as facial expressions and other visual cues help them better understand a character's mood or feelings.

Enriching advanced readers with complexity and depth

Graphic novels often have a more complex range of vocabulary because authors have to carefully choose their words since they are at a minimum compared to a traditional book. As readers at a lower skill level can better comprehend the story, advanced

readers benefit from reading it at a deeper level, analysing how the text and images work together to build characters and the plot of the story.

Teaching kids to read today's visual world

Having the skills to read a graphic novel prepares children to learn the visual literacy skills they need to "read" the modern world around them. We are surrounded by infographics, the visual navigation of websites, icons, digital games and even everyday signage. The popularity of graphic novels is in part due to the changing nature of how we communicate.

Simplifying complex books and ideas for young readers


