Explore Lartelare Reserve Venture into a place steeped in cultural significance and natural beauty. Here, you can uncover stories of the past, connect with the heritage of local Aboriginal peoples and immerse yourself in a tranquil sanctuary on the Port Waterfront.

Port River Eco Walk Lace up your walking shoes and embark on the Port River Eco Walk. It's not just a stroll — it's a journey through vibrant ecosystems teeming with life and stories waiting to be discovered. Download the Visit Port Adelaide app and follow the self-guided trail.

Stockade Park Located in Northfield, this beautiful park, which was formerly associated with a prison quarry, is now a lush oasis with water features, an amphitheatre and picnic areas. Explore its rich history and enjoy the beauty of its sensory garden, perfect for visually impaired individuals and nature enthusiasts alike. Spending time outdoors is more than just a chance to reconnect with nature -- it can help you find joy in the simple things and nurture a deeper appreciation for the world around you.

Guided Port walks

Enjoy a guided walk around historic Port Adelaide with a passionate local volunteer. Let them take you back to the mid-1800s and learn what life was like for the early settlers and how it came to be that Port Adelaide was dubbed

'Port Misery'. \$5 per person. Walks are generally held on the last Sunday of the month. Check dates and book by scanning the QR code.



Self-guided tours

If exploring on your own is more your style, download the Visit Port Adelaide app for access to interactive self-guided tours that encompass everything from local history to the supernatural. Download the app for free from Apple and Play Stores today, or simply search 'Visit Port Adelaide'.

Art gallery exhibitions

Every month the Art Gallery at the Port Adelaide Visitor Information Centre (VIC) features a different exhibition from a local artist or collective. Come and check them out every month. Local artwork makes great gifts! Follow the VIC on Facebook for exhibition updates and information on what's happening.

Free bike hire

Hire a bike for free from the VIC and go for a ride around the Port's State Heritage Area or the Waterfront Loop Path — or stray a little further afield and tackle the Coast Park path. Coast Park is a 70km-long pedestrian and bicycle path following the metropolitan Adelaide coastline, starting at North Haven and going right through to Sellicks Beach. Benches, toilets and picnic areas are dotted along the scenic trail.

RECIPE OF THE SEASON

Watermelon and feta salad

Not only is this salad delicious, it's also a great way to stay refreshed on long, hot summer days.

Ingredients:

- 4 cups peeled and cubed watermelon (bite-size pieces)
- 1/2 cup crumbled feta cheese
- 1/4 cup fresh mint leaves
- 1/4 cup thinly sliced red onion
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- I tablespoon balsamic vinegar
- Salt and pepper to taste

Method:

- Place the watermelon cubes into a large salad bowl.
- 2. Add the crumbled feta cheese.
- 3. Tear the fresh mint leaves and add them to the bowl.
- 4. Add the sliced red onion to the other ingredients.
- In a small bowl, whisk together the extra virgin olive oil and balsamic vinegar to create a simple dressing. Season with a pinch of salt and pepper.
- 6. Drizzle the dressing over the watermelon, feta, mint and onion.
- 7. Gently toss all the ingredients together until they are well coated with the dressing.
- 8. Taste the salad and adjust the seasoning with salt and pepper, if needed.
- 9. Serve immediately or refrigerate for a refreshing and cool summer salad.

THE SMART WAY TO COOL DOWN

Solar-powered irrigation system

During the last few years, we have installed over 100 'smart water' controllers to irrigate PAE's 231+ gardens, parks, reserves and grassy areas. These smart water controllers reduce water consumption by assessing and modifying water flow rates in various conditions, adjusting the water flow in response to the weather. They also prevent water runoff, can detect leaks and are remote-controlled, meaning that we do not

have to send crews out to switch sprinklers on or off. Three of these smart water controllers are linked to a solar panel and battery to reduce reliance on grid energy, further reducing emissions.

Keeping our reserves lush and green while reducing our water consumption is one way that we can keep our City cool and help local biodiversity. It also saves money, improves our corporate emission profile and takes the pressure off the River Murray — so it's a win all round!

FIGHT THE BITE

Enjoy a mozzie-free summer

As the temperature rises it is time to gear up for the annual mosquito season in South Australia. These pesky insects can quickly turn your outdoor activities into itchy nightmares — but fear not! With a little knowledge and preparation, you can enjoy a mosquito-free summer.

Top tips:

- Eliminate standing water: Mosquitoes breed in stagnant water. Regularly check and empty buckets, flowerpots and gutters around your home to reduce their breeding grounds
- Use mosquito nets: Consider installing mosquito nets on doors and windows to keep these unwelcome guests out of your home
- Wear protective clothing: When heading outdoors, cover up with long sleeves, pants and socks to minimise exposed skin.
 Light-coloured clothing can also help deter mosquitoes
- Apply mosquito repellent: Use a mosquito repellent with DEET, picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus on exposed skin to keep mosquitoes at bay. Remember to follow the instructions on the label
- Avoid peak mosquito hours: Mosquitoes are most active at dawn and dusk. Plan your outdoor activities accordingly or use extra precautions during these times
- Maintain your garden: Keep your garden well-maintained to reduce hiding spots for mosquitoes. Trim overgrown vegetation and remove debris that may collect water
- Consider citronella: Citronella candles or torches can provide some relief when spending time outdoors. Place them strategically to create a mosquito-free zone
- Stay informed: Keep an eye on local news and government alerts for any updates on mosquito-borne diseases and recommended precautions

Remember that mosquitoes can be more than just a nuisance — they can also transmit diseases such as Ross River virus and Barmah Forest virus. Be proactive and protect yourself and your family from these tiny troublemakers. By following these tips, you can enjoy a worry-free and mosquito-free summer!

2022—23 HIGHLIGHTS

Greening our City

We are committed to planting at least 3,000 new trees in our streets and reserves annually to achieve our target of increasing PAE's tree canopy by 35% by 2050. During 2022-23, we exceeded our planting target while also establishing the 'Get Shady' Project to increase the number of trees planted on private land. Through this scheme, we provided 150 property owners in 2022 with a free advanced (Im-high) tree to plant on their land.

We have also created a new grants scheme for significant and regulated trees (which are trees with a circumference of 2m and over). Landowners can apply for a Council reimbursement of up to \$1,000 to help with tree maintenance works on their properties.

Polonia Reserve and playground are now open

This year we launched the new play space and reserve at Polonia Reserve in Croydon Park, which includes an open kickabout lawn and a play space, featuring a stunning soccer ball

playground sculpture that pays homage to the site's sporting past. Polonia Reserve is just one of eight playgrounds that we completed this year, as we continue to create places for the community to experience and enjoy.

Supporting connections at a local level

During 2022-23, we offered a year-long calendar of events through which residents could get together, including celebrations on Harmony Day and Neighbour Day, as well as the many fabulous events associated with the South Australian Living Artists (SALA) Festival, Nature Festival, Nunga Week, Refugee Week and History Month.

Partnering with businesses

Through innovative partnerships and grants programs like our Green Business Incentive Scheme, we support businesses in PAE to grow and thrive while investing in renewable energy, energy efficiency, zero-emission transport or plant technologies. During the 2022-23 year, we awarded II Green Business grants, with overall funding awarded through the scheme totalling \$57,362.

Yitpi Yartapuultiku

We have continued to work with the community to progress the design for Yitpi Yartapuultiku, the Aboriginal Cultural Centre that we are planning for PAE. At the same time, through programs supporting connection at the local level, we have progressed our work to provide spaces where people can be active and have the opportunity to connect with each other to improve their health and wellbeing.

Net Zero Emissions Plan

Our commitment to supporting clean energy has gone from strength to strength this year as we implemented the Net Zero Emissions Plan, made green building improvements to Council facilities, replaced petrol vehicles with electric vehicles (EV) and installed EV charging stations. We also delivered on our significant capital works program, with upgrades to local playgrounds and sports facilities and improvements to our roads and stormwater management infrastructure. It's cruise season again

South Australia's cruise industry is gearing up for a record-breaking year in 2023–24. With 42 cruise ships scheduled to arrive in Outer Harbor over the season, bringing 76,000 passengers and a significant boost to the local economy, the City of PAE is playing a vital role in supporting this thriving industry.

To sustain the success of what has become over the past decade the fastest-growing sector in the state's economy, the South Australian Tourism Commission has launched the South Australian Cruise Ship Action Plan 2025. This plan aims to promote South Australian ports as safe and appealing cruise destinations, ensure high-quality service, stimulate investment in new experiences, and encourage cruise line passengers to

disembark and explore the region.

The City of PAE plays a pivotal role in supporting this industry with our Cruise Shuttle Bus Service, which operates on dates when the biggest ships will be arriving, encouraging passengers to explore local attractions, experiences and businesses in the local area. We also support local businesses and tourism operators to take advantage of the influx of visitors.

For those interested in catching a glimpse of these floating palaces as they cruise South Australian waters, Semaphore and Lady Ruthven Reserve offer the best vantage points. STOP THE SPREAD

Free immunisation clinics in PAE

Did you know that PAE provides free monthly immunisation clinics? Immunisation protects more than your child's health — it also helps stop the spread of illness to your family, neighbours, friends and the community. It uses the human body's natural defence mechanism to build resistance, which is a simple, safe and effective way of protecting children and adults against certain harmful diseases. Importantly, the risks involved with contracting one of these diseases are far greater than the very small risk associated with getting the immunisation. At PAE, we conduct four public drop-in clinics each month where accredited Registered Nurses provide a public health service in accordance with guidelines stipulated by the National Health and Medical Research Council.

The 2024 calendar will shortly be published on our website and will also be available from our local Libraries and Civic Centre. No appointments are necessary, and you may attend a session at any venue. Scheduled vaccines for children and adolescents are available free to all Medicare Card holders through these clinics. Other non-scheduled vaccines can be purchased by the general public at a cost.

EMPOWERING OUR YOUTH

Equipping young people for the workforce

After identifying an opportunity for programs aimed at upskilling young people aged 13–17, The Lights Community and Sports Stadium co-ordinated a Basic Barista Workshop and an accredited Full First Aid Course as part of their October school holiday program.

The First Aid course was facilitated by Mental Muscle, and with thanks to the PAE Youth Team, I I local participants were able to access the course at a subsidised price. This accredited course gave participants vital lifesaving skills, including CPR, wound care and emergency response.

Meanwhile, 10 young people attended the Basic Barista Workshop, with spots filling up quickly. Participants were eager to grasp the basic skills required to perfect espresso shots and latte art. Delightful Café and 1645 Coffee Roasters facilitated this workshop and were pleased with the amount of engagement from the budding baristas.

PAE Libraries also identified the need to support young people with the necessary skills to prepare for getting their first job. Together with the PAE Youth team, Workforce Australia and Headspace, six young jobseekers created their resumes, prepared interview skills, debunked workplace myths and met local employers. The 'Get that Job!' workshop took place at the Greenacres Library, with participants leaving it feeling more confident about their next steps. Best of all, these workshops helped participants add skills, confidence and qualifications to their resume, which will help set them apart in the eyes of prospective employers.

Creating a safer workplace

The City of PAE is proud to announce that we have successfully completed the White Ribbon Australia Workplace Accreditation Program. White Ribbon Australia is part of a global social movement working to eliminate gendered violence. It is striving for an Australian society where everyone is safe wherever they are, including in our workplaces. Participation in the White Ribbon Australia Workplace Accreditation Program, which is now facilitated by community service organisation Communicare, involves a whole-of-organisation commitment to addressing issues of gendered violence and sexual harassment in the workplace. Accredited organisations must meet 15 criteria under three standards demonstrating that they are creating a safer and more respectful workplace through taking active steps to stop gendered violence. The program is internationally recognised and to date has also reached more than 600,000 employees nationally.

All the Latest on our LED Lighting Upgrade

Our LED Lighting upgrade project is set to begin in January. During the first half of 2024, we will replace around 6,500 stobie-pole mounted lights in residential streets. The upgraded LED lighting will improve road user safety at night by illuminating roads and footpaths effectively and efficiently. Once fully installed, the new lights will save approximately \$380,000 per year on electricity, and there will be further savings on maintenance costs.

Community transport

Community transport services will finish running after the last service on Friday 22 December 2023 and will resume the regular schedule from Monday 8 January 2024. There will be no community transport services between these dates.

Kerbside waste collection

If your bins are normally emptied on Monday, our truck drivers will instead empty your bins on Tuesday over the Christmas/New Year holiday week. As both Christmas Day and New Year's Day fall on Monday this year, your bins will instead be collected on Tuesday 26 December and Tuesday 2 January. Your bin collection will resume its normal schedule on Monday 8 January 2024.

If your bins are normally collected on a Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday each week, your collection date will not be affected by the Christmas/New Year season, so please place your bin out on the kerb as usual.

The Visitor Information Centre will be open every day of the holidays except for Christmas Day, so if you are looking for something to do over this period, head down to the Port to explore the area. 
