Council is strongly committed to improving the cultural, spiritual, health, emotional and economic wellbeing of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island people in this region.


In consultation and collaboration with the local Aboriginal community Council will:

# NAIDOC WEEK

NAIDOC Week is for Australia to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, by Australians from all walks of life. The week is a great opportunity to participate in a range of activities alongside your local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander community. Normally NAIDOC Week has been celebrated in July, but this year we have moved it to November.

Each year there is a NAIDOC theme; this year the theme is "Always Was, Always Will Be" which recognises that First Nations people have occupied and cared for this continent for over 65,000 years.
